*H	PA	14 Mar 1733	Thomas Newport and Anne Barker married, First Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia PA. ("Old Buttonwood Church";s side High (Market) St bet Bank & Strawberry; 1st graveyard in 1737) <i>in same day; Stephen David & Sarah Boham</i>	"PA Archives" 2 series v.9 p.52&LDS468374
*I	MD?DE	22 Nov 1756	Jesse Newport, yeoman of Worcester Co MD, buys from Thomas Newport, yeoman of Worcester Co MD, household implements, farm implements & animals. (It's absolutely provable that Jesse is our ancestor.)(both can write; animals include 7 cattle) <i>Worcester Parish (Episcopal)</i>	Worcester Co MD deed book D pp.107-8.
*J	MD/DE	29 Apr 1758	Pew assignments for the new Prince Georges Chapel (at Blackfoot Town on the S.side of Peppers Creek) includes: # 34 William Baker, Ann Newport, Daniell Davenport Dagsborough Village:"In deeds recorded previous to 1785, it is mentioned 'as the place formerly called Blackfoot town, but now Dagsbury.'" *L	PA	6 Dec 1791	Jesse's half sister Mary signs her will; bequeaths include nieces/nephews surnamed Baker & Carmalt and cousins surnamed Reagon & Edwards and children of 1/2 brother Jesse. <i>Jesse</i>	PhilaCo PA will book W pp.251-4.
