My apologies for being so slow in answering your letter of May 28, 1983. On April 23 I started on a genealogy-sightseeing-visiting friends/relatives trip, and I did not get home until July 15; I went 7,600 miles and hit about 18 libraries between here and West Virginia. I stopped in Salt Lake City at the Mormon Library on the return trip. I just got home and before getting things put away, I had 4 weeks of Jury Duty. Just finished that a couple days ago.

I am very interested about your David Long who died in Sussex County, Delaware in 1785, leaving wife Ann, and children, David Jr., Benjamin, John, Armwell, Mary, Elizabeth, Nancy, Rachel, Myrom, and Joyce. You say that Elizabeth, your ancestor, married Jesse Newport about 1750 in Delaware and the family soon moved to the Philadelphia area. Do you mean that Elizabeth and her husband moved to Philadelphia, or that Elizabeth's parents moved to Philadelphia? I presume it was only Elizabeth and her husband since David Long died in Sussex County, Delaware. Do you have the spouse's names for any of Elizabeth's brothers and sisters?

I have a John Long, Sr. born 1685, and married about 1710 in Queen Anne's County, Md. to Elizabeth Powell. She died after 1730 but before 1746. She was the daughter of Ann and George Powell of Queen Anne's County. John Long Sr. died February 1746-7 in Queen Anne's County. His father was David Long and his mother Mary .....  
John Long Sr. and wife Elizabeth Powell had at least 3 children, who were:

1. David Long born ca 1712; married ?
2. Mary Long ; married Mr. Flowers
3. Elizabeth Long born ca 1718; married William Roberts on March 17, 1737 at St. Lukes Episcopal Church, Church Hill, Queen Annes's Co. Md.
4. John Long Jr born 1722; married Ann Herrington (same church as above). This is my direct line. The were married 12 July 1744.

Our family history says that John Long Jr. and Ann Herrington were both born in Williamsville, Baltimore Hundred, Sussex County, Delaware. Do you think that their child #1 could be your David? Here's hoping. Let me know.

My apologies for being so slow in answering your letter of May 28, 1983. On April 23 I started on a genealogy-sightseeing-visiting friends/relatives trip, and I did not get home until July 15; I went 7,600 miles and hit about 18 libraries between here and West Virginia. I stopped in Salt Lake City at the Mormon Library on the return trip. I just got home and before getting things put away, I had 4 weeks of Jury Duty. Just finished that a couple days ago.

I am very interested about your David Long who died in Sussex County, Delaware in 1785, leaving wife Ann, and children, David Jr., Benjamin, John, Armwell, Mary, Elizabeth, Nancy, Rachel, Myrom, and Joyce. You say that Elizabeth, your ancestor, married Jesse Newport about 1750 in Delaware and the family soon moved to the Philadelphia area. Do you mean that Elizabeth and her husband moved to Philadelphia, or that Elizabeth's parents moved to Philadelphia? I presume it was only Elizabeth and her husband since David Long died in Sussex County, Delaware. Do you have the spouse's names for any of Elizabeth's brothers and sisters?

I have a John Long, Sr. born 1685, and married about 1710 in Queen Anne's County, Md. to Elizabeth Powell. She died after 1730 but before 1746. She was the daughter of Ann and George Powell of Queen Anne's County. John Long Sr. died February 1746-7 in Queen Anne's County. His father was David Long and his mother Mary ..... John Long Sr. and wife Elizabeth Powell had at least 3 children, who were:

1. David Long born ca 1712; married ?
2. Mary Long ; married Mr. Flowers
3. Elizabeth Long born ca 1718; married William Roberts on March 17, 1737 at St. Lukes Episcopal Church, Church Hill, Queen Annes's Co. Md.
4. John Long Jr born 1722; married Ann Herrington (same church as above). This is my direct line. The were married 12 July 1744.

Our family history says that John Long Jr. and Ann Herrington were both born in Williamsville, Baltimore Hundred, Sussex County, Delaware. Do you think that their child #1 could be your David? Here's hoping. Let me know.
