Thoroughbred Cagers Win First Four "Mighty Five" Tops W. Palm Beach, Central Easy Pickings

Despite having the two worst referees in the state, and having Bernie Butts thrown out of the game in the third quarter, Hialeah's cagers won a 75-59 victory over West Palm Beach in a game that beheld everything but a brawl.

Gables Downed 70-50

Hialeah opened their basketball season with an impressive 70 to 50 victory over the Coral Gables Cavaliers at the Gables gymnasium. The Thoroughbreds held a 12-9 lead at the quarter and then opened the lead to 19 points at halftime. Bernie Butts continued his scoring ways from last season as he bucketed 13 baskets and 12 free throws for 38 points.

Wally Dale contributed 14 points for the losers. Last season the Cavaliers dealt Hialeah a stunning loss in a sudden-death period for one of the T-Breds' five losses.

Hialeah lost the Junior Varsity game despite fine efforts on the part of Charles McBeath (17 points) and Tony Saladino (13 points). The final score was Coral Gables 67—Hialeah 46.

against Hialeah which at first made Coach Roy Brawner mad, but he soon realized the foolishness of it and laughed in disgust.

After the first quarter, the Wildcats realized they couldn't beat Hialeah fair, so they decided to rough it up a bit. This, the referees didn't see, but when Butts was fouled by three men at one time, he got mad and told the referee. "You better watch out or the Hialeah fans will get you after the game." The fans were behind him one-hundred percent. If Hialeah hadn't won the game, heads would have rolled.

After the game Bernie stated, "If I ever see that guy (ref) again, I'll kill him myself." Before being thrown out, he managed to compile 18 points to give him a 32.7 average for four games.

Glen Parker was high-point man for the Thoroughbreds with 28. He ran the Wildcats mad using the fast break and opening the game up in the final quarter.

Verle Beebe, Palm Beach's so-called "big man" didn't hit his usual fifty percent, although he did score 24 points. His mind was on stopping the T-Breds any way he could, as was the rest of the team.

This was the Thoroughbreds' hardest fought, and also best played game of the season.

Palm Beach took the Junior Varsity game easily.

Four players hit for double numbers as the T-Bred cagers downed last year's runner-ups for the District Eight title, Miami Beach, 80 to 56.

Bernie Butts hit for 34 points while Tony Cocco contributed 13. Glen Parker and Dick Krtausch each sank 12 points in Hialeah's sparkling effort.

The Thoroughbreds looked exceptionally good at the foul line, dumping in 30 foul shots.

After leading by a slight 15-11 margin at the quarter, the T-Breds drew away to a 38-25 lead at intermission. They increased the margin to 61-41 entering the last quarter. The substitutes took over and outscored the Typhoons 19-16 in the final frame.

The junior varsity won their first game of the 1958-59 campaign by topping Beach's "B" squad 52 to 39.

Central Catholic won the Junior Varsity game 39 to 29 after trailing the T-Breds throughout three quarters.
