"This plan," continued Sergeant Askew, "is called the Army Career Group Enlistment Options, or the 'Choose - It - Yourself' Training System, and is a tremendous forward step which will provide the prospective enlistee, who can qualify, with on the job or school training in the occupational career group of his greatest interest. He will subsequently be assigned to that type of work without regard to branch of service. Under this new plan the individual will be guaranteed in writing, his choice of vocational training before he enlists for service."

Sergeant Askew stated that basic military training will, of course precede the specialized occupational training.
