5. Powder Pointers: Apply as much powder as you can smear on your face and neck. This will make your complexion look creamy and white, even ghostly.

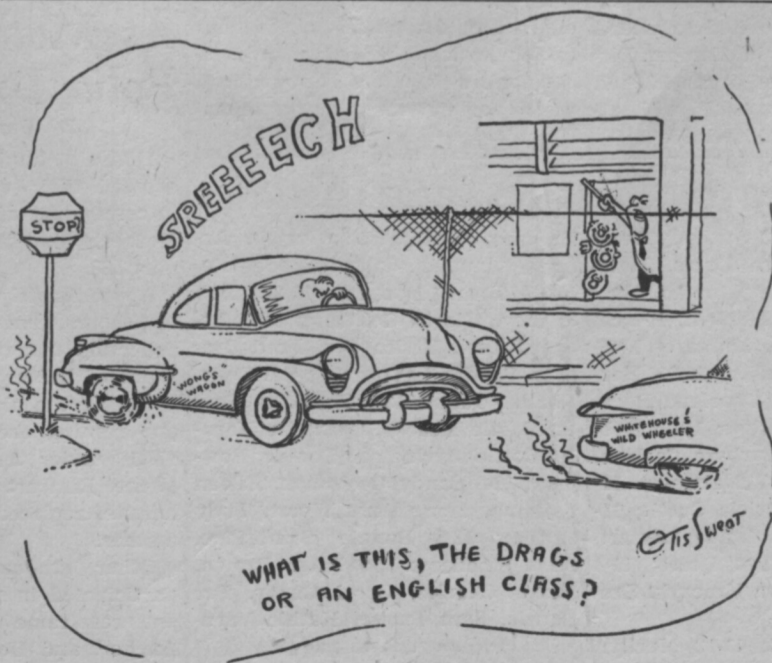
