## T-Breds Lose - Win Over Broward County Opponents

Hialeah suffered their first Gold Coast Conference loss to Central Catholic 61 to 58 then rebounded the following week to down Stranahan's Dragons 66 to 48.

Central took a commanding 15 to 7 lead in the first quarter and stayed off a late T-Bred surge to gain their first Conference win.

Stranahan, fresh off a win over South Broward stayed within striking distance and then lost their chances in the final period. Hialeah outscored them 19 to 6 in that quarter to hand the Dragons their third loss of the season. They had won ten and were in contention for the Northern Division Title.

Bernie Butts scored 27 points in each of these games to hold onto his scoring percentage. Tony Cocco tallied 11 against the Raiders and dumped in 17 in swamping Stranahan. Dick Krtausch collected 12 points against Central and Vern Futrell had his big night in scoring ten against Stranahan. These games gave the Thoroughbreds a 7-1 record in the Northern Division. Palm Beach has lost only two (both to Hialeah) to take over second place. South Broward and Stranahan have dropped three apiece.

## Butts Breaks County Scoring Record — Scores 61 As T-Breds Stomp S. Broward

Amazing Bernie Butts now holds one of the highest and most recognized records in the county—for the most points made in a single game. Bernie achieved this against the South Broward Bulldogs in the Hialeah Gym. His 61 is five points better than Bobby Balch's previous high of 56 made two years ago.

The fact that the Thoroughbreds defeated the Broward team, 88 to 52, was secondary as the fans seemed to sense that Mr. Butts was nearing the record. With three minutes remaining, Coach Roy

Browner had his first string do nothing but feed eBernie. He then had 51 points. His nine-point victory over the Bulldogs was certainly the most exciting since coming to Hialeah.

The only thing he had to say after the game was "I'm Tired." And why not! He had a shooting percentage of 52.7, bucketing 23 field goals and 14 free throws. At half-time, he had 24 points and Tony Cocco had the other 12 as the T-Breds led 36 to 23. Cocco wound up the evening with 17 points to keep him one of the top scorers in

the county. Butts is on top.

The other six Hialeah players deserve credit for doing a fine job of helping Bernie and Hialeah achieve this record. Tony Saladino hit for five points and Lou Moran collected three. Vern Futrell and Otis Pewitt each dunked a foul shot. Glen Parker and Dick Krtausch were held scoreless.

Dick Fishel topped the Broward scorers with 17 points. Mickey Preng also popped in eight points.

## T-Breds Still Battling For District Eight Lead

Hialeah racked up two District wins in a row over Jackson and Coral Gables. The Gables victory (78-77) was the Thoroughbreds' second win over them. Hialeah led by six points going into the final quarter and held on to gain the one-point victory.

Jackson took a first period lead and then faltered as the Hialeahs won 71 to 52 at the Jackson gymnasium. This is where the District Eight playoffs will be held this year, as in the past.

Bernie Butts was held to 23 points against the Generals but reversed these figures (32) against the Cavaliers. Lou Moran got his highest amount also against the Cavs, 19 points. Dick Krtausch and Sophomore Tony Saladino, who was recently moved up from the junior varsity each tallied 11 points. Krtausch racked up 16 against Jackson, and Tony Cocco put in a sparkling performance with 18.

17 of Butts' points came in the high-scoring third period when the two teams dumped in 54 points together. Wally Dale, Gables high-point man was held to six points in the first half, but wound up with a total of 26.

Jackson's "big" man, Ernie Yaroshuk, played his first game in two weeks against the T-Breds, and although he saw limited service, he scored eight points. Ronnie Scott was high for the Generals with 13 points.

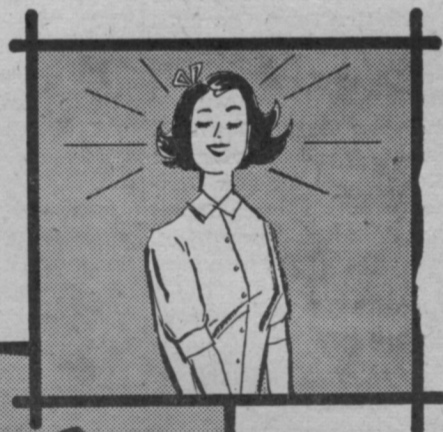
