Questions Asked By Curious Girls

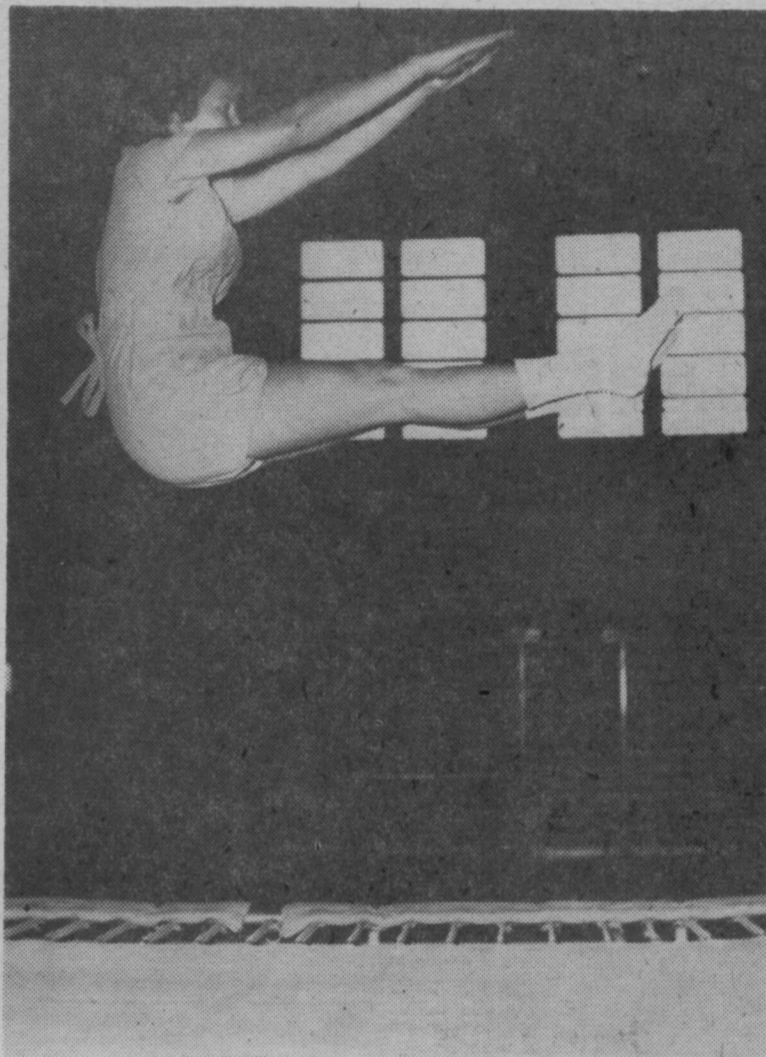
"What am I today, a girl or boy?" This is the question that emanates from the location of the girls' locker room these days; as several of the leadership classes begin square dancing.

BUTTS DEFINITELY TOPS IN COUNTY

Bernie Butts scored 621 points in 21 games for a total average of 29.6. This is four points better than any average in Dade County prior to this season.

Tom Baxley of North Miami has played 22 games (as this paper goes to press) and has two more to go. He has 601 points and will probably break Butts' record, but I feel that the system is unfair.

The two games in which North Miami took part in the Christmas Invitational at South Broward are counted for Baxley. These were not regular season games.

District games are not counted so why should tournament games be. Without these games Baxley would not have broken Butts' record despite having played 22 regular season games.
