

Hialeah Cagers Close Out Regular Season Play

T-Breds Drop Second to MiHi T-Breds Down

Stranahan Downs T-Breds 84-77

Five Stranahan players scored in double figures as the Dragons gained revenge for an early season loss to the T-Breds, by downing them 84 to 77 in the Lauderdale teams' gym.

Dick Hursey scored 20, Tom Rogers 16, Bob Mazzola 14, Dick Konstadt 13, and Ron Barber 12, give the Dragons one of their top victories of the season.

Bernie Butts pulled to within 10 points of breaking the County scoring record with 33 points, but this was not enough. Glen Parker returned to top form, hitting for 16 points.

Hialeah jumped out to a lead in the first minute of the game, but Stranahan tied it up and then led throughout the final 30 minutes. Every time the T-Breds tried to narrow the margin, the Dragons would pour on the pressure and pull out of reach. They controlled the backboards throughout the game.

Pete Sackmann and Charles MacBeath led Hialeah's junior varsity squad over Stranahan 50 to 38.

Sackmann scored 17 and MacBeath contributed 11. Leonard Coleman, Steve Kallo, Jack Corbitt, and Jay Wolfe also played a good game.

Miami High took command from there on out. They scored four quick field goals and then staved off a last minute threat by the T-Breds to continue to lead the county standings.

One of the most thrilling plays of the game came with two seconds left to play in the first half. Hialeah called time out and then, Bernie Butts took the ball out at half-court. He passed to Glen Parker and he hit with a one-hand push from 30 feet out.

Other than this, it was a very unpleasant night for the T-Bred fans. This game makes the Stingarees the favorites when the District Eight Tournament starts on March 5.

Pete Somerindyke had a big night scoring 22 points. Bob Paterson connected for 16 and Dave Austin gathered 11.

T-Breds Down Edison 77-58

Hialeah's cagers ended their regular season by defeating Miami Edison (the Stingaree killers) 77 to 58 at the Hialeah gymnasium.

Tony Saladino scored 16 points, Glen Parker 14, and Bernie Butts, 24, as the T-Breds put forth their best effort since early in the season.

Free throws won the game for Hialeah. The team made 27 out of 30 (20 out of 22 in the second half) to spark their victory.

Edison led throughout the first quarter, and stayed within striking distance until the fourth quarter, then Hialeah drew away easily.

The Thoroughbreds ended the season with a 17-4 record and Bernie scored a record 621 points for a 29.6 average per game. This gave the six-foot senior a total output of 1,081 for two seasons at Hialeah.

T-Breds Clinch Northern Division

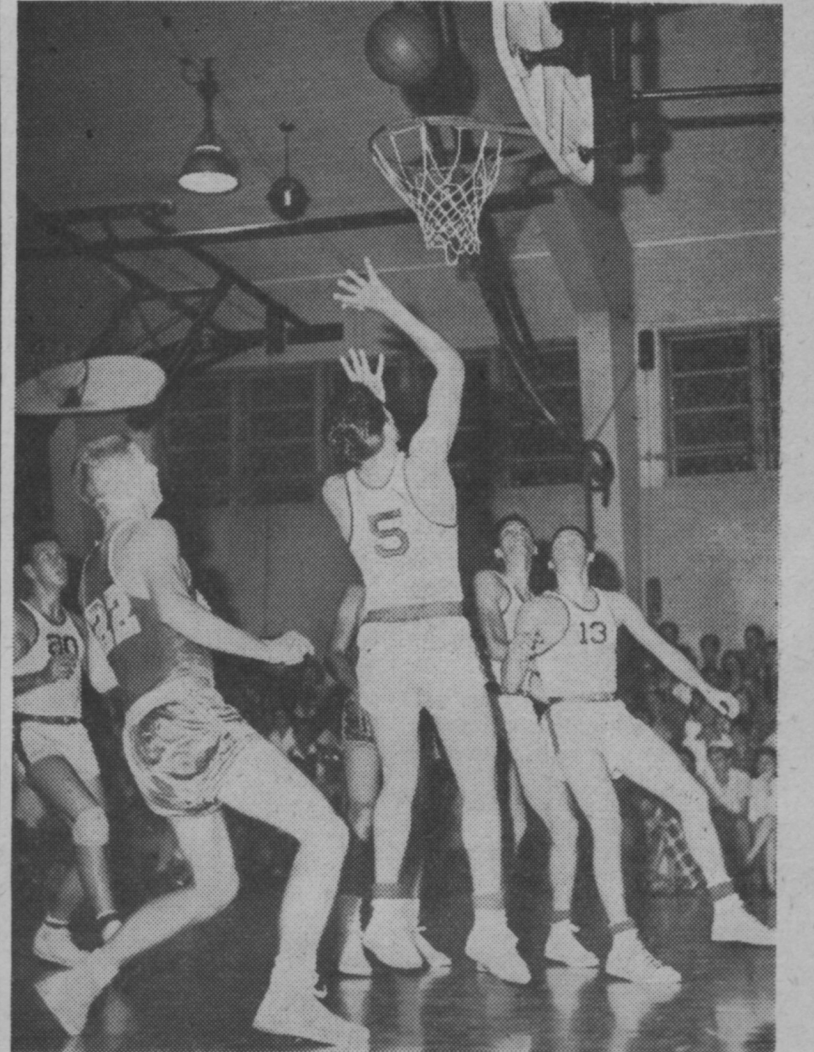
Bernie Butts and Tom Baxley tied with 19 points in their shooting duel at Hialeah with 19 points, but more important, the Thoroughbreds clinched the Northern Division of the Gold Coast Conference by holding the Pioneers scoreless in an overtime period and winning 59 to 51.

The game was close throughout the regular four quarters with neither team leading by more than four points.

With less than a minute remaining in the final quarter, the Hialeahs led 51 to 47, but North Miami pressed the Hialeah offense and tied the game on one of Baxley's one-hand push shots.

Butts controlled the ball in the overtime period and hit for six points to give the T-Breds a decisive win.
