Hialeah Drops First Three

Hialeah opened their baseball season on a losing note to Curley's Knights, 6 to 5, on Curley's diamond.

The Thoroughbreds drew first blood in the fourth inning when Marv Williams drove in two runs with a double. Curley quickly struck back in the bottom of the fourth with four runs. Andy Monticello's towering home run to left field was the big blow.

Hialeah evened the score in the fifth when Bernie Butts blasted a home-run to right-center with one man on. Both teams scored one run in the sixth, but in the bottom of the seventh a sacrifice fly brought in Curley's sixth and winning run.

GABLES WINS 3 TO 2

Hialeah lost a heart-breaker in their second game of the season on the Coral Gables athletic field to the Cavaliers 3-2.

Gables put a single run on the scoreboard in the first, third and fifth innings. The T-Breds earned their two runs in the sixth inning when Marv Williams and Pete Sackmann scored. It was too little—too late.

What proved to be the winning run for the Cav's was credited to a much-contested balk by Pete Sackmann.

9 TO 4 — SOUTHWEST

Southwest High showed too much power when they handed the Hialeah nine their third loss of the season at the Southwest field.

Three pitchers were used by Coach Charles Wychunas in a futile attempt to stop the Eagles, but the final score was 9 to 4 in favor of Southwest.

A stolen base by Bernie Butts and some sloppy fielding on Southwest's part allowed Butts and Willy Williams to score in the first

inning. Immediately following, the Eagles scored three runs.

The T-Breds tied the score in the second when Williams was hit by a pitch and Bill Hamilton reached first on an error. Vern Futrell sacrificed to move Williams to third and Ronnie Lindquist followed suit with a fly that sent Williams home with Hialeah's third run. Southwest again scored three runs in the bottom of the second.

Hialeah got one more run in the sixth, but it just wasn't enough.

T-Breds Win Over Tech, 5 to 0

Hialeah put their first mark on the winning side of the ledger when they defeated Tech High 5 to 0 at Curtis Park.

In the second inning of this contest the T-Breds racked up their first double-play of the season. Hialeah scored in the second inning when Ted Groome opened with a double and quickly advanced to third when Willy Williams grounded out on a fielder's choice. Pete Sackmann, the Thoroughbred pitcher, walked, and Don Ruth followed with a single to drive Groome home.

The sharp-hitting Hialeans, seemingly not satisfied without a bigger lead strengthened it in the third. Marv Williams led off with a sharp double to left center and was immediately sent home when Dick Krtausch singled. Krtausch stole second and once again it was the big bat of Groome's that drove Krtausch home with a single.

In the fifth, Ronnie Lindquist, Blake Rowe, and Groome teamed together for two more Hialeah runs and a shutout victory for Pete Sackmann.

Tech's only threat came in the sixth inning when the Blue Devils had the bases loaded with two out, but Sackmann soon put out the fire.

Niklos Takes First Place In Southwest Invitational

Hialeah, Southwest and West Palm Beach gymnasts won the bulk of the events at the First Annual Southwest Invitational Gymnastic meet.

Mike Nicklos brought home a first place in tumbling for Hialeah's "high-flying team and Lenny Glick topped all competitors on the side horse. Tony Caccavale took a second on the flying rings as did Jimmy Devlin on the high bar. Wayne DeBerry placed third in the rope climb. On the long horse, Nicklos placed second and Lanny Fyfe conquered third.

This meet was set up so that the best boys in South Florida were invited to participate. No recognition of team's points was given. The boys were only to receive credit on their individual events.

Southwest's Arnold Finn won both rings events (still and flying) Joe Greene topped the competition on the trampoline for Southwest's other first place.

Nick Gonzalez on the ropes and Leonard Wolf on the long horse accounted for Coral Gables first place votes.

Thoroughbred Gymnasts Win

Mike Nicklos and Jim Devlin each grabbed two firsts and a second place for a total of 17 points each to pace Hialeah's gymnastic team to a 102½ to 56½ victory over Coral Gables at Hialeah.

Nichols topped all competitors in the long horse and tumbling events. Devlin topped all entries in the free exercise and horizontal bar. Lenny Glick took a first on the side horse, Lanny Fyfe first place on the still rings, and Tony Caccavale captured first place on the Flying Rings.

Lannom Leaving Hialeah for F. S. U.

For the first time in Hialeah's history, Coach Hal Lannom will not be guiding the Thoroughbreds through the football season in '59.

Coach Lannom will begin his one-year sabbatical leave June 15th for his first summer session at Florida State University. Administration and supervision will be his majors and his schedule will be completed with various religious courses.

After completing his year of study, Lannom will need only six more credited hours to receive his hard-earned Doctorates Degree. He will return to Hialeah in 1960, but his eye is on a place in the administration.

Taking over the reins for Hialeah's gridiron horses will be

Robert Eskew, who has assisted Coach Lannom since Hialeah opened. Eskew and Lannom attended high school together and then Eskew went on to Middle Tennessee State, where he was tailback and also an end. Hiss college career also included being editor of the newspaper and president of the student body.

Coach Eskew will also be attaining his doctorate this summer when he enrolls at Peabody College in Nashville, Tennessee.

Moving up to the vacancy as Head Track Coach will be Landon Darty. Eskew holds this post now in his initial season. Jerry Salek, a former track coach left Hialeah in 1957 to gain his degree at Columbia University.

Hialeah 11th As Edison Wins Cav Track Meet

It was a long wait for Edison High's Raiders before they were finally declared the winners of the Coral Gables Invitational Track Meet at the University of Miami athletic field.

At 11:30 the results were in and Edison had won 53 and three-quarters to 48 and one-half. Hialeah finished eleventh with seven points. 19 teams were entered in the meet, the largest this season.

Nine records were broken in this second year of competition. Alan Wright was high point man in the meet with four first place honors and 17½ points.

WALLACE FIFTH IN MILE

Hialeah broke the scoring ice when Tom Wallace, captain of the T-Breds team, finished fifth in the mile run. The winning time was 4:37.5 and Miami High captured the honors. Wallace was clocked in 4:43. flat.

Otis Pewitt picked up two more points in the 440-yard dash by placing fourth. He defeated all competitors in this heat and was clocked in 53.5.

KALIO VAULTS TO SECOND

Highlighting the evening's activities for Hialeah was an upcoming sophomore star, Steve Kalio in the pole vault. He finished second with a jump of 12 feet-three inches and did this in his third meet of the season. Steve failed to make the 12 foot-6 inch jump in three tries and so first place honors went to Edison.
