New Cheerleaders Join HHS Squad

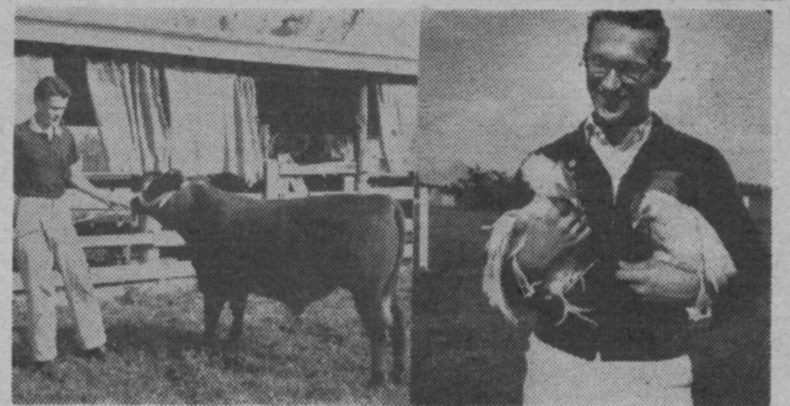
