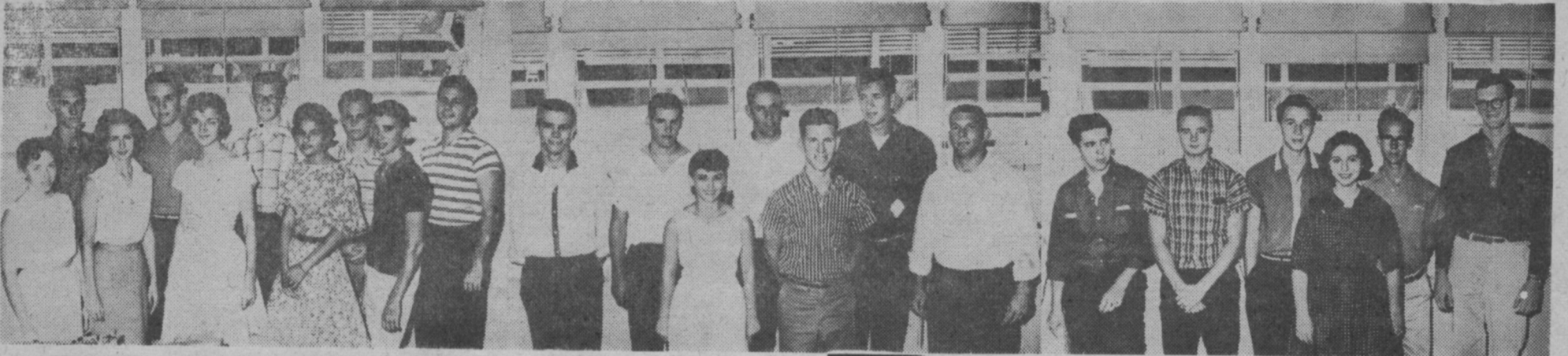


Twenty-Three Scholars Earn 'Way to College'
