

## TV Has Summer English Course

Many of Hialeah High's students may be more than willing to discontinue their studying for the summer after the public school term ends on June 5th.

However, there are others who will be continuing their education for an additional eight weeks in June and July—via television. Educational television, WTHS in Miami, which has been utilized in school this year, will be used in broadcasting an English course on a post-high school level.

This course, naturally, will be no push-over. It is to be directed toward the goal of aiding the high school students who will be going to college or into a business field requiring a good command of the English language.

College credit will be awarded to students who successfully complete the course. Instructional fees are nil, but the cost of workbooks and other educational guidance material will cost about \$6.00. Assignments will be given on television during the 7:00 to 7:30 A.M. classes and will be mailed by students.

A question and answer period followed Mayor Milander's address, during which the students bombarded him with pertinent questions concerning the advantages of a city government as opposed to the Metro plan. Mr. Milander took on all questions and seemed pleased with the interest shown by H.H.S. students.
