THOROUGHBREDS FACE ROUGH OPPONENTS

Hialeah opens the 1958 football season in its initial year as a Gold Coast Conference team, this Friday night against Central Catholic of Ft. Lauderdale, also a new addition to the Conference.

Strong hopes lie on the back of Captain-quarterback Dick Krtausch and the other 10 lettermen who are returning.

Aside from Central, the T-Breds tee off with four other Gold Coast teams, including three of the strongest, Ft. Lauderdale, South Broward and North Miami. All have their eyes on the Gold Coast title.

Edison and Jackson aren't as powerful as expected but they won't be easy pickings. Jackson is trying to recover from the worst year in history.

McArthur is the vision of Hialeah four years ago, with no seniors. Watch out for them in the next two years! Norland and Columbus (revived St. Theresa) are also in this category. Stranahan hasn't proved that they have anything over last year's eleven.

All the strength of the Gold Coast seems to be in the Northern District. The Southern teams seem to be lacking the experience that the Yankees have.

Lauderdale is big and aggressive, but still lack the experience that Flying "L" teams have shown in the past.

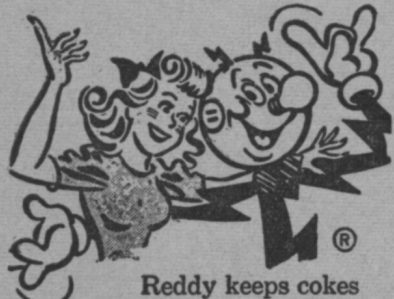
