C. B. E. Students Career Minded

Cooperative Business Education or C.B.E., as it is most commonly called, has become one of the most interesting, as well as important opportunities, which has been presented to H.H.S. students.

Scholastically, the requirement is to maintain a C average or better, along with the desire and ability to work in a business office. The monthly dues are \$1.50, all funds needed for the annual banquet which is held towards the latter part of the year, for C.B.E. students.

School for the C.B.E. students varies quite differently from the normal school hours. These business students go to school from a quarter of 8 until the end of third period (11:45). Ordinarily most of the students report to work at 12:30 while others report even later in the afternoon.

Grades received from C.B.E. are partially derived from sheets filled out by the employers, reporting the student's progress and capability.

Mr. H. Olivero, C.B.E. sponsors these career-minded students, and is well liked by all, because of his thoughtfulness and encouragement.

Connected with C.B.E. is Diversified Cooperative Training, or D.C.T. as it is regarded. Most projects or entertainment are functioned together, such as the recent "Splash Party", which was held at the Airways Hotel Pool, for only C.B.E. and D.C.T. members, on October 4.

N. H. S. Plans Future Tapping
