Thanks for this little visit . . . hope to see you again in this spot of your paper again next time . . . Until then, see you on the air today at 4 PM . . .

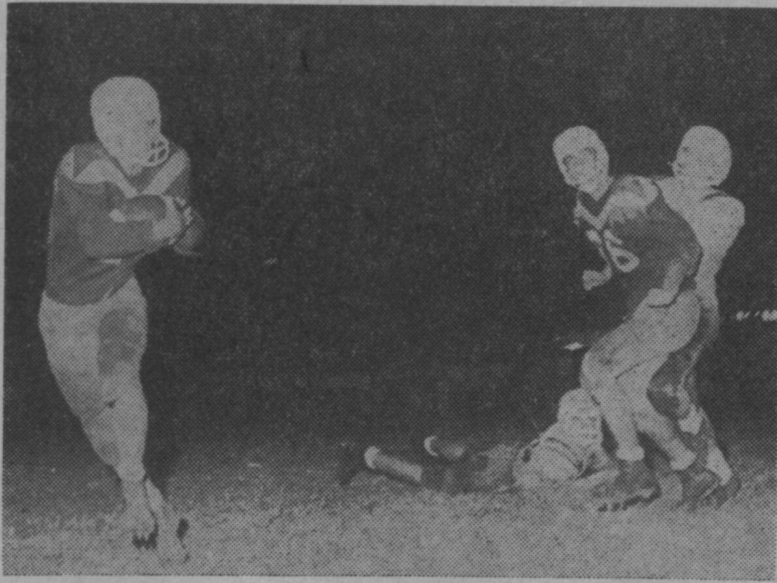

The "leaders" were found as the six man power backfield came through. Paul Donaldson, Bob Tafel, Art Lancour, Bill Stafford, and Dick Krtausch all scored touchdowns with Lancour adding three extra points to his credit.

Naples scored their only touchdown when end George Newchick

recovered a fumble and raced 55 yards. Buddy Askew added the extra point.

Penalties were the big bug in the Hialeah attack as they were penalized 170 yards to Naples 10. Illegal use of hands hurt the T-Breds tremendously.

The only chance Naples had in the game was to pass and Buddy Askew tried diligently, but to no avail as he failed to connect with any of his passes.

Naples failed to gain a first down throughout the game. Hialeah racked up fifteen.
