

# Hialeah Looking For Upset Against Edison

## Thoroughbreds Beat Central Catholic, 26-13

Paced by a strong passing attack, Hialeah's Thorobreds started their initial year in the Gold Coast Conference with a 26-13 victory over Central Catholic of Ft. Lauderdale.

Captain-quarterback Dick Krtausch was the big gun in the T-Bred attack. His passing led to three of the touchdowns. Hialeah tallied midway in the first quarter on a 42 yard jump-pass from Krtausch to left end Lewis Moran. Bob Tafel set up the TD play with 45 yards gained on three plays. Art Lancour kicked the extra point.

At the close of the second quarter, Hialeah scored its second touchdown with Krtausch scoring from the one on a quarterback sneak. This capitalized a 63-yard drive with the T-Breds racking up six first downs with Art Lancour carrying for good yardage around the ends.

Central Catholic started their offensive drive at the start of the second half. Lynn Whalen, on the first play, took a handoff, went off right guard, and romped 63 yards for their first touchdown. Whalen missed the extra point.

Hialeah's third touchdown again came on a pass from Krtausch to Moran who went 28 yards into the end zone. Lancour's kick was nullified by a 15-yard penalty.

In the fourth quarter a 56 yard pass from Drake Batchellor to John Lynch gave Central a first down on the Hialeah eight yard line. Within three plays, Bill Wright had scored from the three. Whalen kicked the extra point.

The Thorobreds closed the door on the Raiders when Art Lancour traveled seven yards for Hialeah's final score. His extra point kick was good.

Richard Curwell and Larry Camp played a great game on the defense.

Halfback Tommy Jackson leads a strong Miami Jackson team against Hialeah on November 15.

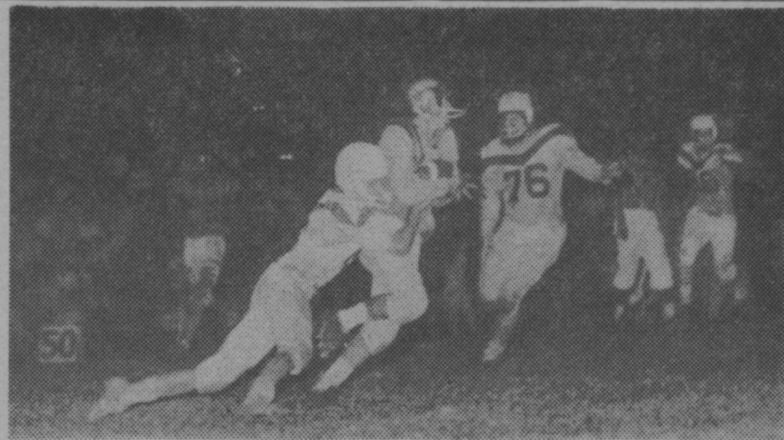
Jackson (the team) is still debating their 27 to 26 loss at the hands of Miami High on the opening night of football in Miami.

## T-Breds Jeopardize Red Raiders' Rating

Hialeah Stadium will be the site of the top game in Dade County on the night of Friday, October 24. Top-rated in the state, Miami Edison's Red Raiders invade the stadium to face a rugged Hialeah eleven.

Edison, 1957 defending State champions and expecting to repeat in that position, started off the season with a thrilling 19-14 victory over Coral Gables in the Orange Bowl.

Haywood Fowle, new Head Coach, has thus far enjoyed tremendous success with his team. They have displayed every inch of fight in them and will not hesitate to take a chance. Fowle himself, is quite a gambler, and as a result they beat the Cavaliers at their own game. Faking a punt on fourth down gave the Red Raiders their big break in that game.

Following in the shoes of Red Bogart (who is now at North Miami) Fowle never makes an optimistic statement. He waits until the conclusion of a game before he predicts the score.

On the other hand, Hal Lannom is looking for the biggest upset Hialeah could hope to see. The boys are in great shape and could ruin Edison's chances for the County title.

Probable starting line-ups for the two teams include in the Hialeah backfield—Paul Donaldson, QB; Bob Tafel, LH; Bill Stafford, RH; Mike Little, FB. Edison's backfield will include four of the best backs in the city. They are Alan Hineman, QB; Darrell Cox and Hap Fick, the halfbacks and Joe Taylor, FB.

### SCOUTING REPORT

Edison works out of a flanker series which they use for their pass plays and pitchout series. Hap Fick generally draws the slot as flanker man or "man in motion".

As a rule when Fick goes in motion early, the play is an end run to that side with Fick taking out the opponents' end. If he goes late, the play is usually up the middle.

Very few pitchouts are called as Alan Hineman loves to run. He passes exceptionally well; therefore the air will be full of passes. Jim Causey, the Raiders left end, is best receiver.

Downfield blocking on punts and kickoffs is poor. The safety men are undecided on where they want to go. Their defense is usually worked out of a 7-2-2. Right linebacker John Roberts is a rough man to get around. The left side appears to be the weakest.

When the going gets rough, they will switch to a 5-4-2 defense with the two inside men charging. This worked well against their opponents thus far.
