

# H.H.S. Pupils Attend S. C. Convention

Four students from Hialeah High were fortunate in attending one of the nation's largest and most important high school conventions held annually. Angel Simonetti, Barbara Lassetter, John Olivero, and Dan Harbolt were all delegates to the Southern Association of Student Council's convention, held in Jacksonville Beach, October 22, 23, 24, and 25.

Accompanied by Miss Ann Combs, Hialeah English instructor, they spent the four days at discussions, problems clinics, and tours of the area.

Representing the 14 states of S. A.S.C. were 700 delegates and 160 sponsors from the various schools. While there, they were addressed by many prominent people of the Florida area, including Gov. Leroy Collins.

Local residents supplied housing for the students, and their spare time was occupied with dances, banquets, and even a football game, all held by Fletcher High School, host for the event.

"Theme of the convention, Spirit of Youth, Hope of the World, was truly justified by the industrious delegates," stated a sponsor from Alabama.

According to John Oliver, "I feel that the knowledge gained from this convention will be invaluable in helping to organize the new Student Council of Hialeah." All of the delegates seemed to concur on this point.

"More equipment may be added as the year progresses," explained Mr. Fardig.

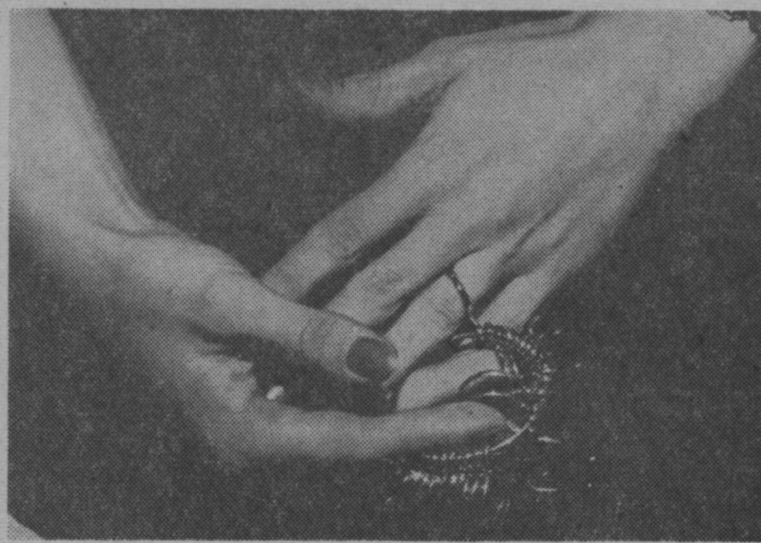
"I'll get better grades now," exclaimed one of the graphics students, while another pupil, referring to the equipment, stated emphatically, "Man, this is the most."

## 4 Tour University Campus

The University of Florida Engineering Conference, sponsored by Eastern Airlines and Florida Power and Light Company, in cooperation with the University of Florida, was held Tuesday, October 28 through Thursday, October 30 at Gainesville, and was attended by four of Hialeah High School's top-ranking mathematics and science students.

Fred Granros, Robert Linden, Bill Rothermel, and Leonard Teel were among the thirty-five Dade County seniors representing the schools of the area.

Leaving early on the 28th, they were flown to Gainesville by Eastern Airlines, and after arriving at the university, were welcomed and given an introductory talk by Dr. R. B. Mautz, Dean of Student Activities.

"The equipment and facilities of the university make it possible to offer a very extensive choice of interest and vocation," Dr. Mautz explained. We feel that with our quality faculty, we have been able to attract quality students," he stated in summarizing.

The four Hialeah students were the guest of the Delta Tau Delta fraternities at the university.

"Fraternities are usually 50% study and 50% social life," commented Buddy Stodghill, a senior in engineering and the house manager at Delta Tau Delta, "but it depends on the individual and how he reacts to college life," Stodghill added.

Freshmen at the university must live in the school operated dormi-

tories on the campus. Bicycles are a common campus sight because freshmen and many sophomores are not allowed to have cars.

Cost of attending the University of Florida averages \$1,100 per year, including registration fee, room and board, cost of books, and various departmental fees.

The first two years at the University of Florida are spent in the University College, which gives the student a foundation for his specialized and technical work the next two years.

"The college is concerned with social, political, and economic relationships," explained Dean W. W. Little of the University College.
