X-Country Team Clips Eagles

Hialeah cross country team literally ran over the Southwest Eagles and the University of Miami's Freshmen squad in a practice meet at the University of Miami course on Friday, October 31.

The Eagles and the Freshmen both have good squads but they were no match for the T-Breds who defeated them with a score of Hialeah 32, Southwest 56, U. of M. 60 (low score wins in x-country).

Captain Tom Wallace placed first in the meet with a winning time of 10:17.

Other high placing boys were Kelly, Groome, Montagno, and Blair. November 7 the T-Breds run against Fort Lauderdale's Flying L's at Lauderdale.

Edison Downs Thoroughbreds

Speedy halfback Darryl Cox scored three touchdowns and literally ran through the Hialeah defenses to lead Miami Edison to a 41-7 victory on their debut at Hialeah Stadium.

Cox took the ball on the first play of the game and went off left tackle for 69 yards and the first back-breaking touchdown. Alan Hineman, Red Raider quarterback, added the first of his five extra points.

Hineman scored Edison's second touchdown from the three, capitalizing a 70-yard drive. Their third touchdown of the first period came when Cox, once again, ran 45 yards off tackle.

The 155 pound speedster made

it 26-0 on a 19 yard end run to start off the second period.

Happy Fick followed blockers 13 yards for the final touchdown of the half.

Hialeah used a spread formation for their pass pattern in the second quarter. They set the halfbacks up as flankers—one inside and one outside the end. This gives the quarterback four targets to hit easily for passes.

The T-Breds marched 65 yards before the Red Raiders stopped the series.

Claude Souder scored the only Edison touchdown in the second half from the three.

Hialeah got some consolation in being the first team this season to score against Edison in the second half.

With four seconds to play, Paul Donaldson unleashed a pass to halfback Bob Tafel for a touchdown. The play covered 53 yards.

Cox really ripped through the T-Breds. They gained 184 yards on 11 plays.

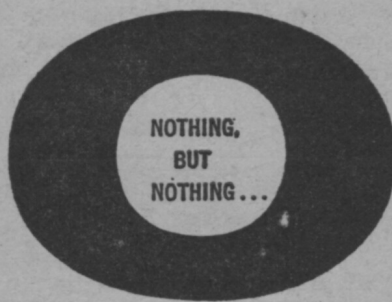

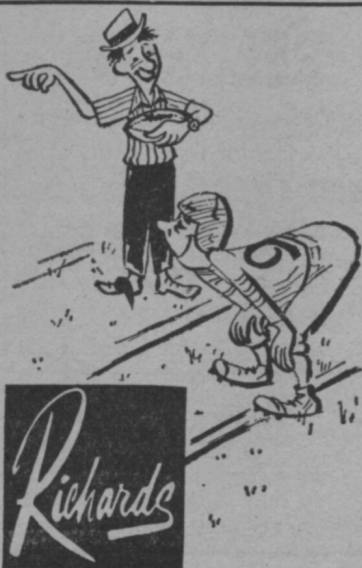

Wright Stops Thoroughbreds 18-13

Alan Wright sped his way for all three touchdowns as South Broward's Bulldogs downed Hialeah, 18 to 13. This gave Broward a big jump on all contenders for the Northern Gold Coast Conference Championship.

Wright took the ball on the third play of the game and romped 55 yards off right tackle for the first touchdown.

Hialeah's first touchdown was set up by a 28-yard pass from Paul Donaldson to Bob Tafel. On the following play, Otis Pewitt shot around left end and went 39 yards for the score.

The second quarter turned the game into a defensive battle and the halftime score was 6 to 6.

Shortly after the second half kickoff, Wright once again scored. This time on a run around right end for ten yards. Midway through the last quarter, he scored around left end on a pitchout from the four yard line. In this quarter, Wright carried the ball on 17 of 21 plays.

Hialeah's second touchdown came on a pass play from Paul Donaldson to Otis Pewitt covering 58 yards. Dick Krtausch added the extra point.

South Broward took the kickoff and held the ball to prevent the Thoroughbreds from scoring again. This game evened up the Thoroughbreds' record at three wins and three losses.

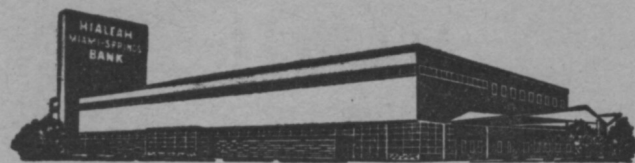
