Hialeah High, as well as several other Dade County schools, is participating in a series of city-wide contests authorized for schools, by the Central Office.

The following is a list of contests that have been approved by the School Contest Committee:

Essay Contest

Sponsor: American Club of Greater Miami (Mrs. Lois Tanner).

One thousand-word essay on advertising. Open to all senior high school students. Local prizes: \$100, and \$25 to the school; 2nd, \$50, and \$15 to the school; 3rd, \$25, and \$10 to the school. National prizes: 1st, \$500 and trip to National Convention in Dallas; 2nd, \$200; 3rd, \$100. Dates: Approximately February 20-March 8, 1959.

Poster Contest

Mark All Papers With Same System
