

Hialeah Loses 21-0, N. Miami Next Foe

JACKSON DEFENSE SHINES
Hialeah played its best game of the season even though they came out of the short end of a 21-0 score, when they played Miami Jackson in the annual Hialeah-Miami Springs Kiwanis Game.

Some 6,000 fans watched a brilliant defensive contest.

In the first period, Hialeah stalled two Jackson drives, on the three and on the eight yard lines.

The Jackson team held the Thoroughbreds to only four first downs and 62 yards gained, 19 of these via the air.

Jackson failed to score in the first period but they tallied in each of the final three.

The Generals' first touchdown came when halfback Allen Jones smashed the center of the line for the final yard of a 66-yard drive which took nine plays to run.

A 55-yard march gave Jackson their second touchdown. Tom Campbell romped 31 yards through the middle.

Carl Ashley intercepted a Dick Krtausch pass on the Hialeah 30 and went for the final tally. This happened when Hialeah was opening up at the end of the game. Ashley also converted all three extra points.

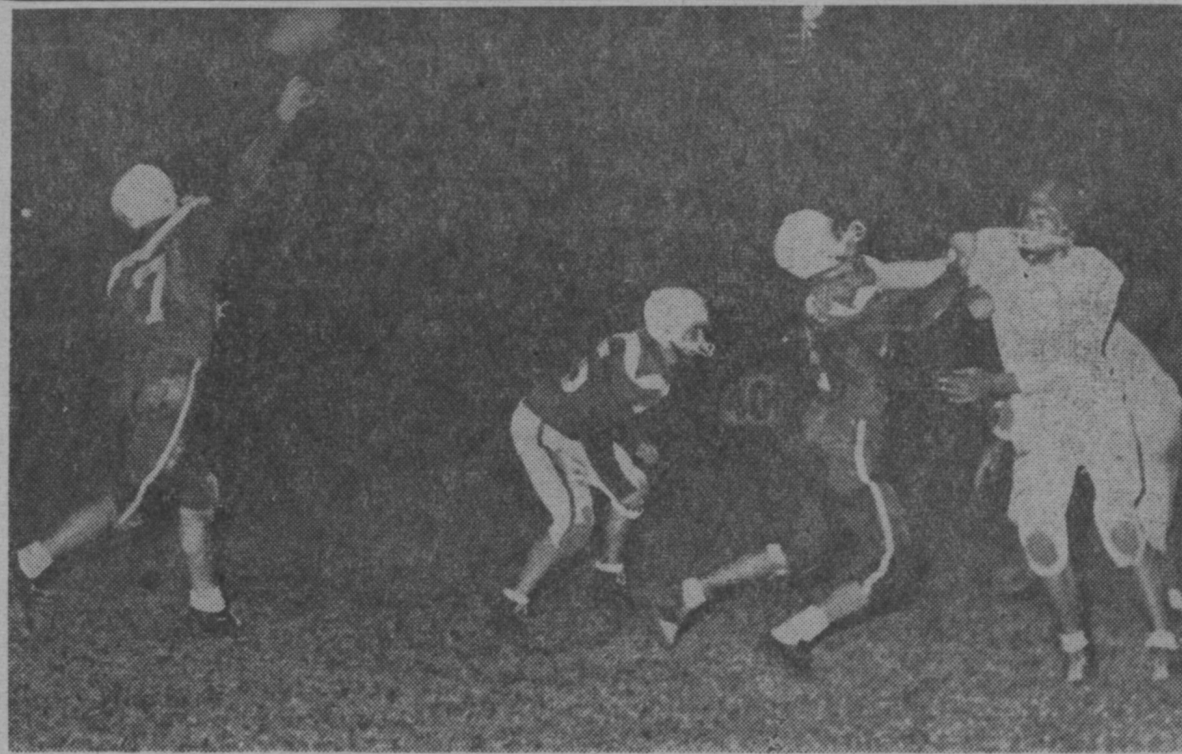
Hialeah's only scoring threat came in the third quarter when quarter back Krtausch intercepted a Bobby Regent pass and moved it to the midfield stripe. Fullback Mike Little carried the ball 29 yards to the Jackson 21 where the Generals' defense got too tough to buck.

Hialeah Romps Over Stranahan

If Hialeah's 32-0 win over Ft. Lauderdale Stranahan, on an extremely muddy field, is any report that the T-Breds are terrific when it's wet, then the Hialeah fans will be hoping for rain when they meet North Miami this Thanksgiving Wednesday.

Hialeah started moving right from the opening whistle and never let up on the Dragons. Bob Tafel scored three times. Otis Pewitt played his second outstanding game, scoring once, and Ernie Trippy added the final touchdown.

The Thoroughbreds opened the game by moving to the Stranahan six-inch line, where they were forced to give the ball to Stranahan on downs. This was the last time that the mighty T-Breds were to be stopped.

Tafel scored his first touchdown in the opening quarter, scoring from the four. Pewitt got his touchdown in the second period when he went off right tackle for 39 yards.

Tafel got his second on a tremendous catch of a pass from quarterback Dick Krtausch covering 25 yards. Stranahan's only scoring threat came just before halftime when quarterback Martin Newman ran 71 yards to the Hialeah 15. They were stopped when Jack Whicker intercepted a Drag-on pass.

In the third quarter, Bill McIver recovered a Stranahan fumble on their eleven-yard line. Tafel, once again scored the TD.

In the final frame, the speedy halfback (Tafel) intercepted a Ronnie Hamilton pass on the Hialeah 27. Hialeah's substitutes moved for the last touchdown with Trippy plunging the final yard.

Stranahan's single-wing offense never had a chance to get started. Otis Pewitt was the Thoroughbred's leading ground gainer. He ran 128 yards on eight carries for a 16-yard average per carry.
