Since most colleges accept only members of the top quarter of the graduating class, they specify that seniors be classified by taking the Senior Placement Test.

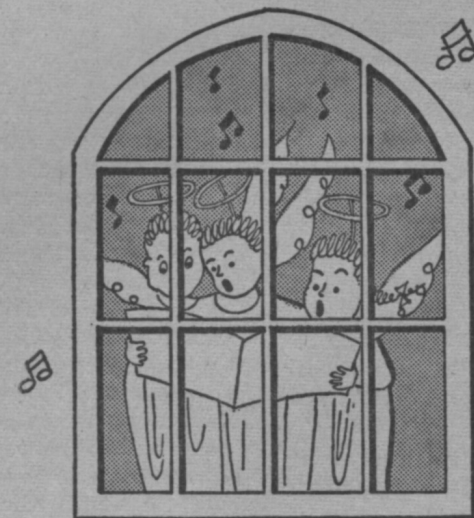
The cost of a college education varies with the institution: however, scholarships are available to almost any college. While in the eleventh grade, students are urged to take the Merit Scholarship Test, which could result in the awarding of a scholarship.

Seniors are urged to take both parts of the College Entrance Examination Board Test, and the Scholarship Qualifying Test, both of which are mandatory for anyone wanting a scholarship.
