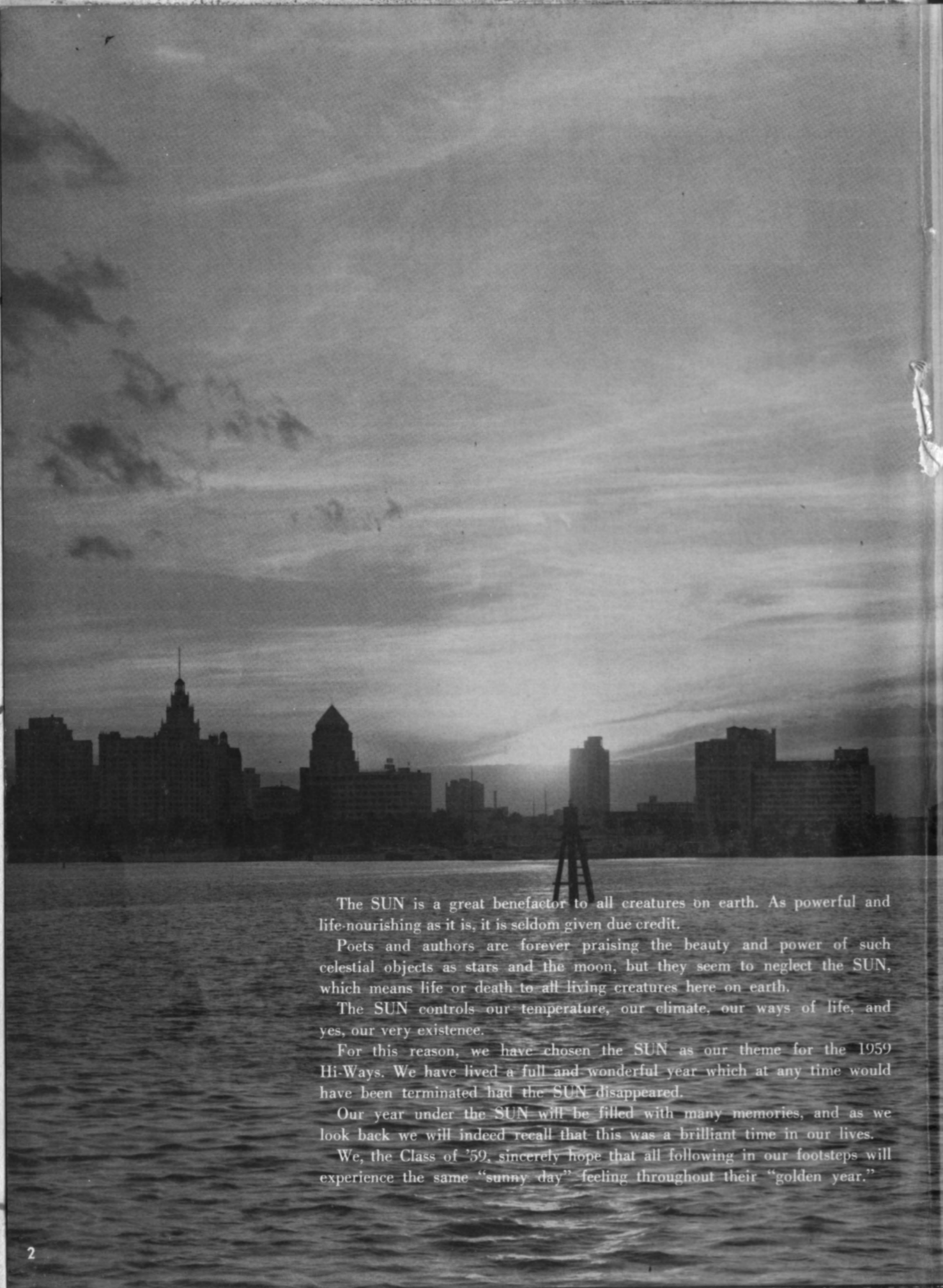

The SUN is a great benefactor to all creatures on earth. As powerful and life-nourishing as it is, it is seldom given due credit.

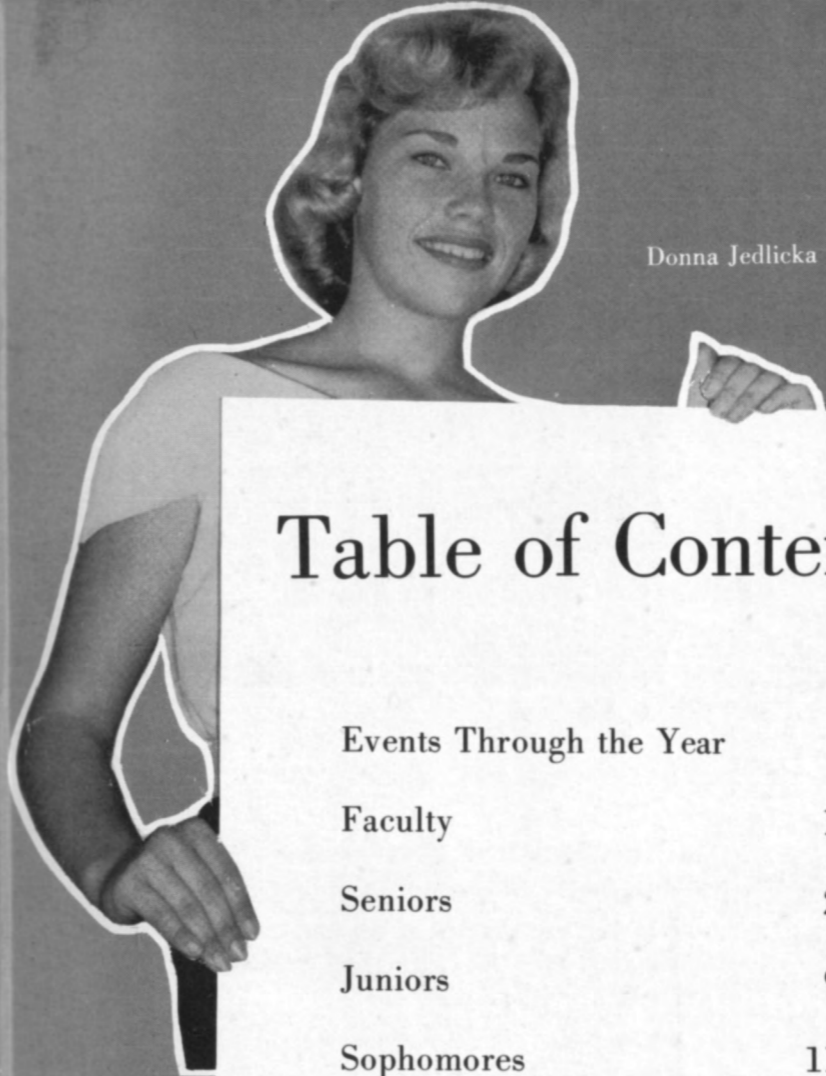

We, as seniors, are progressing to a radiant sunset but many behind us will rise as does the sun.



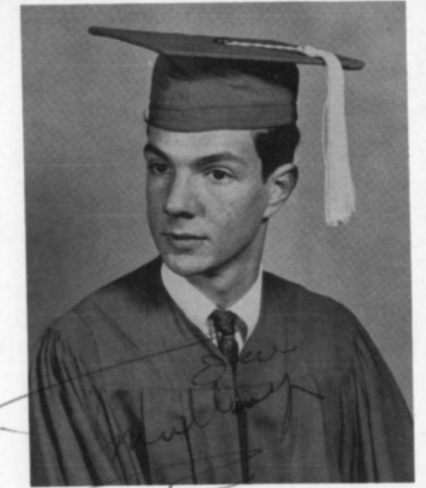

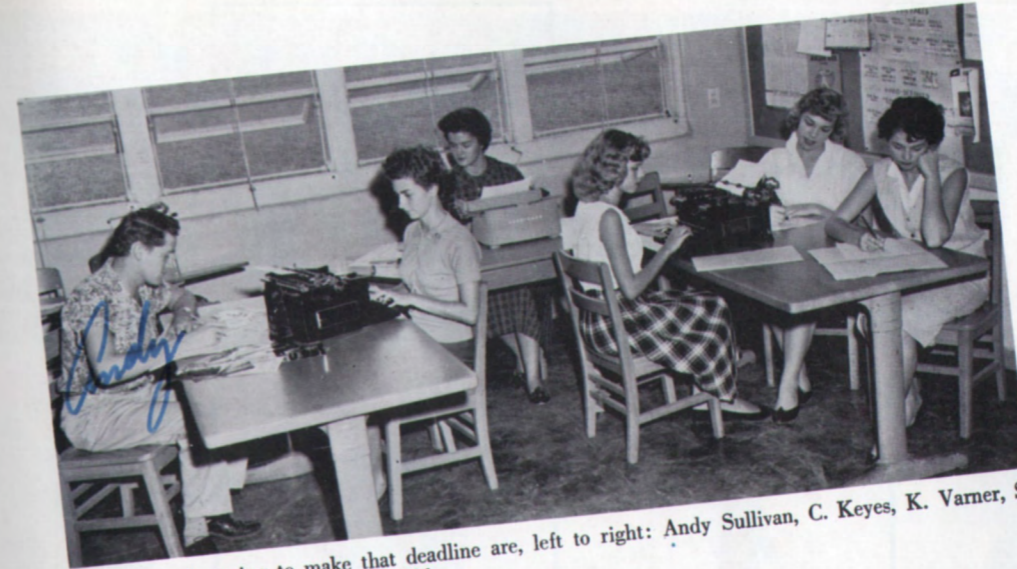

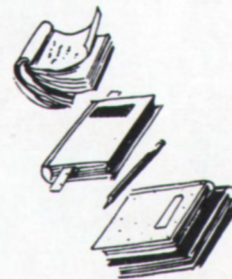

Many of the Hialeah players attended only two practices before the game due to an epidemic of influenza.

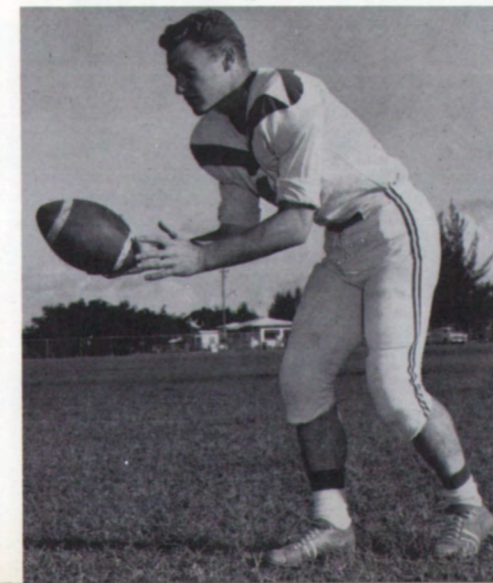

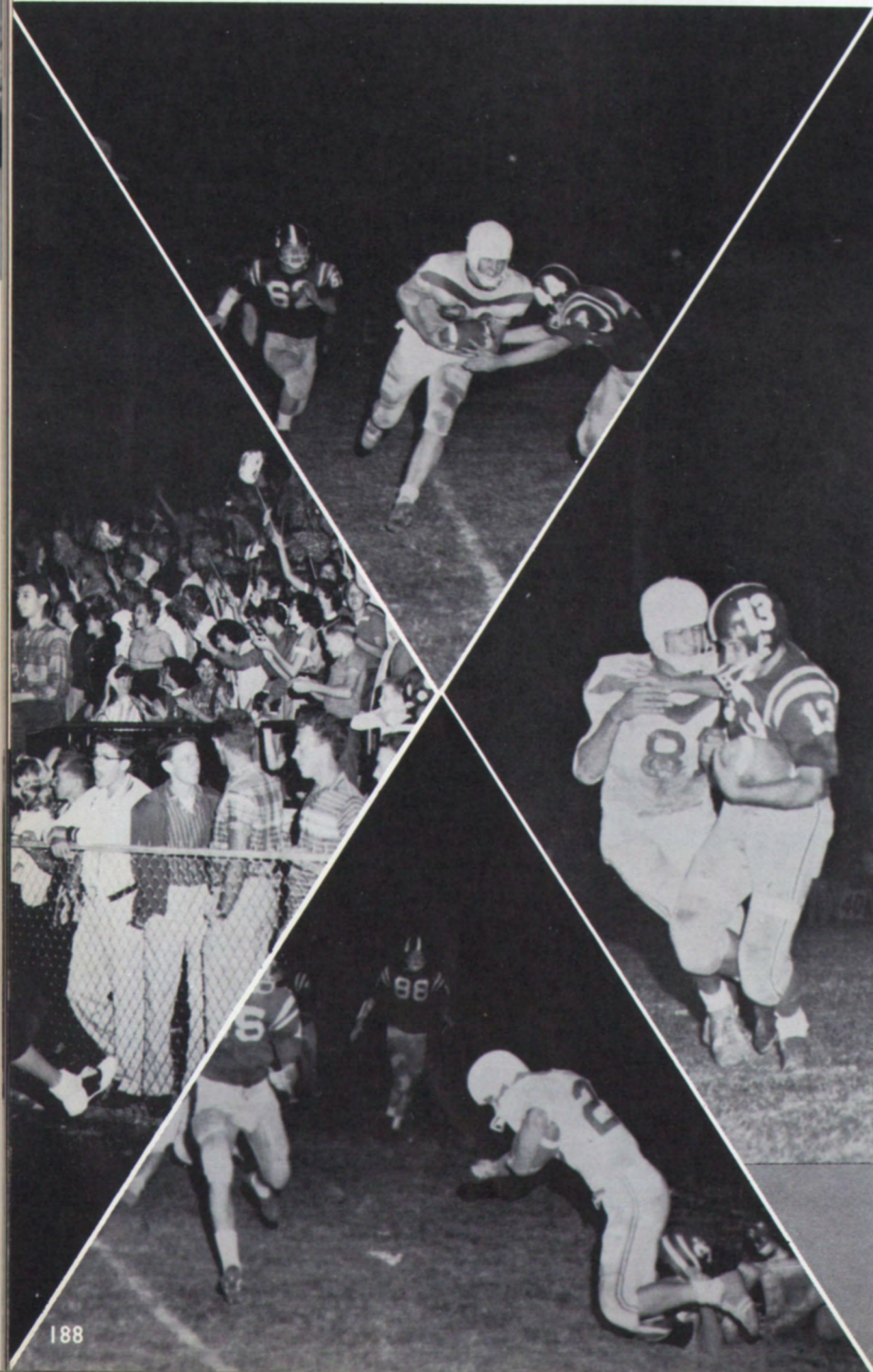


Edison Over-Powers T-Breds 41-7

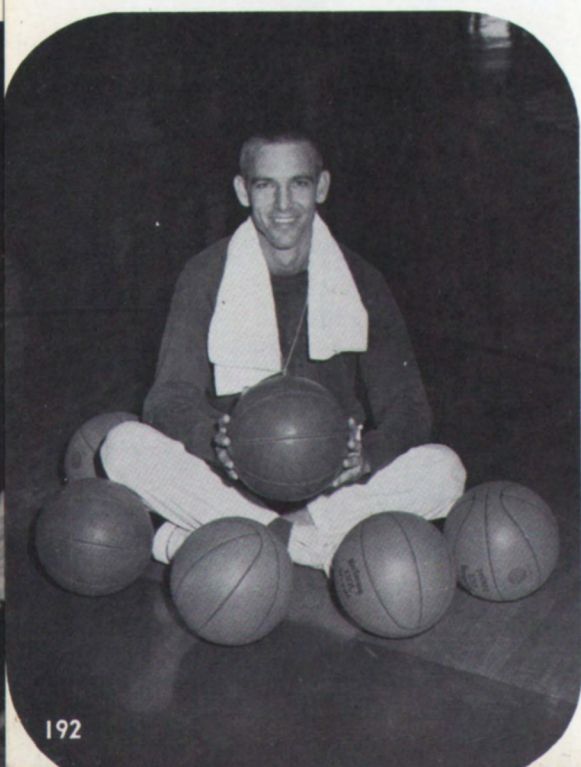




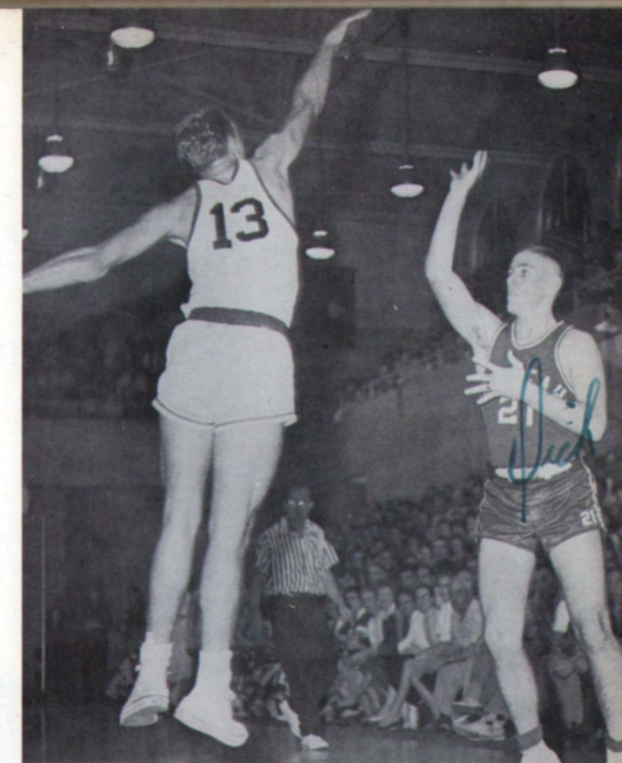

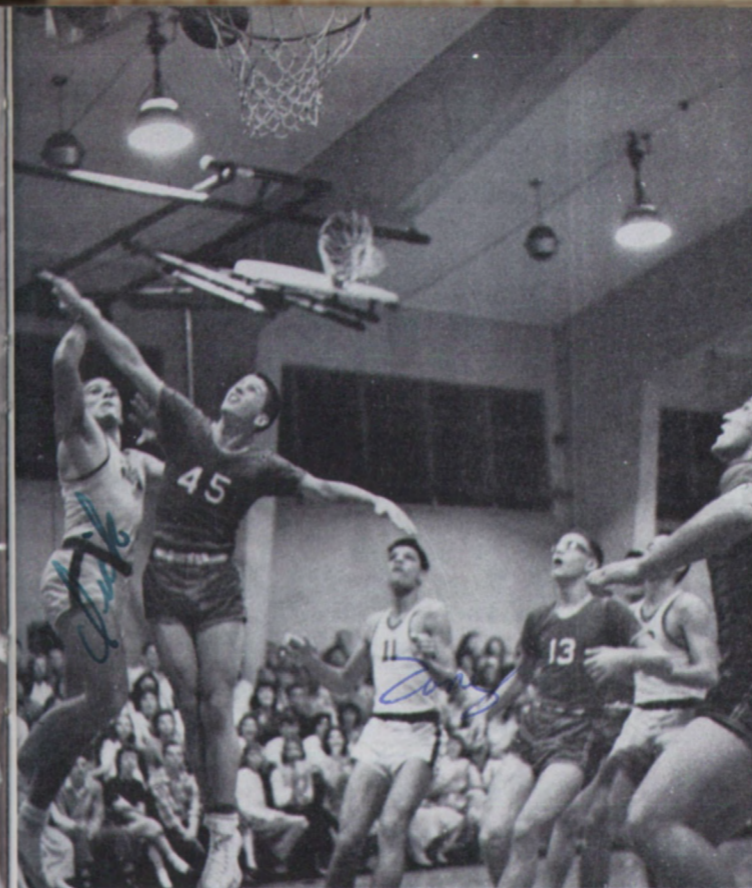

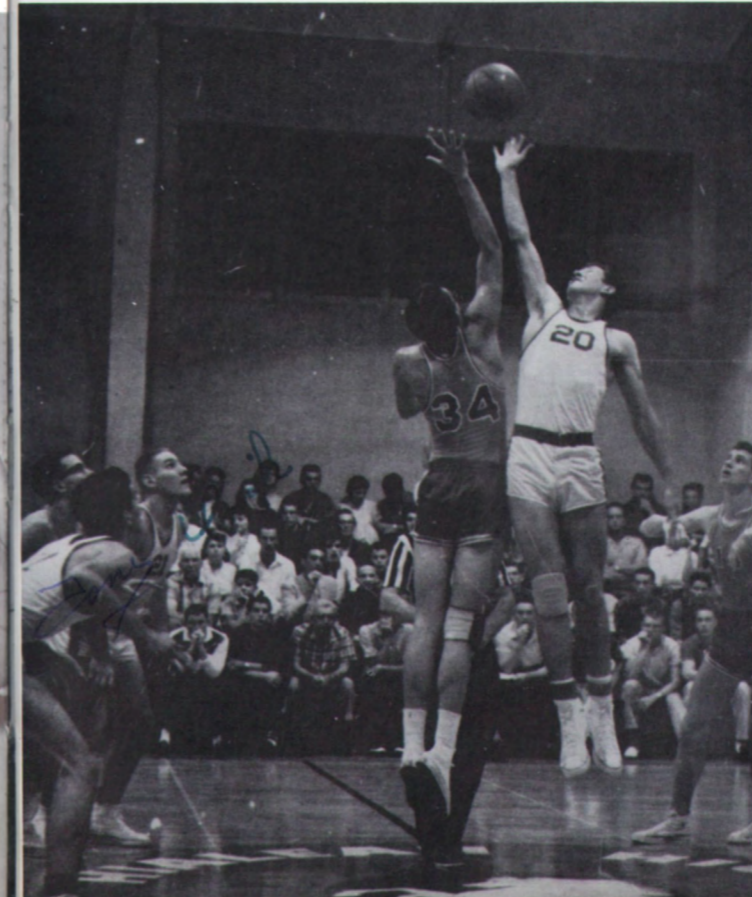

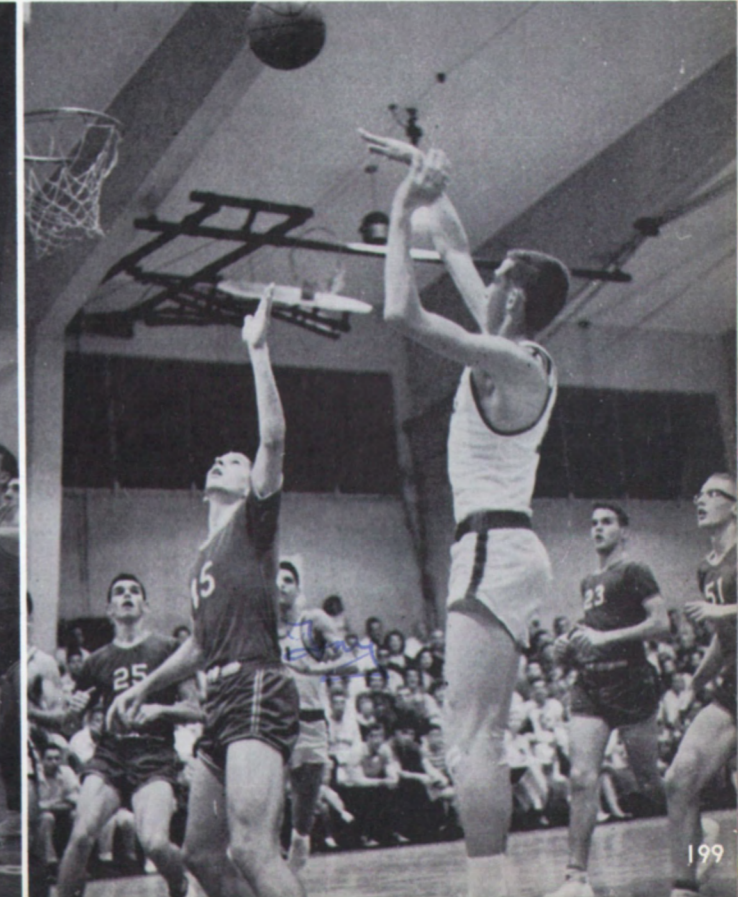

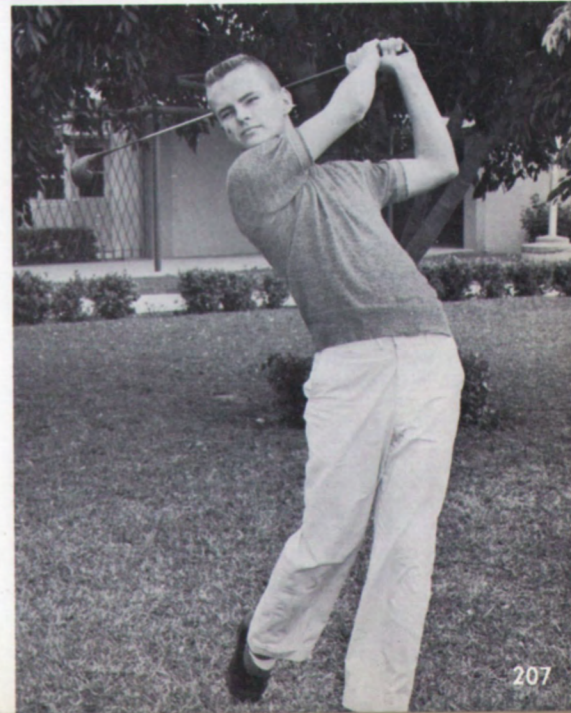

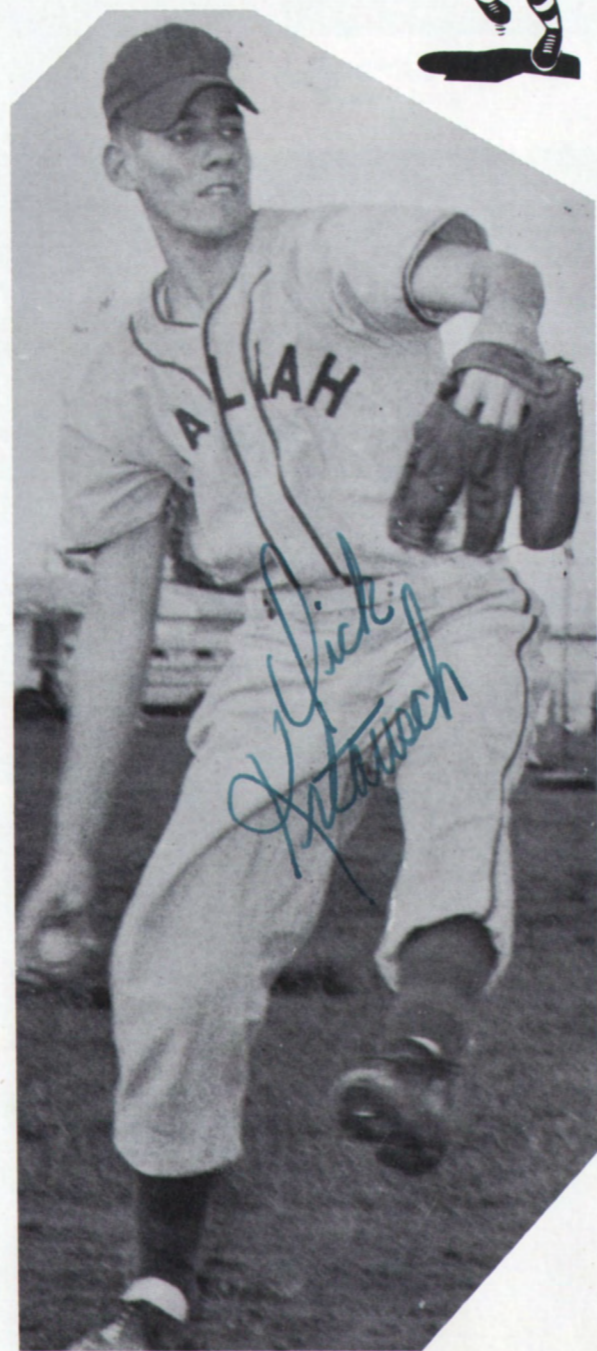

Tennis Team Sets Pattern for Teams in Coming Years at Hialeah High

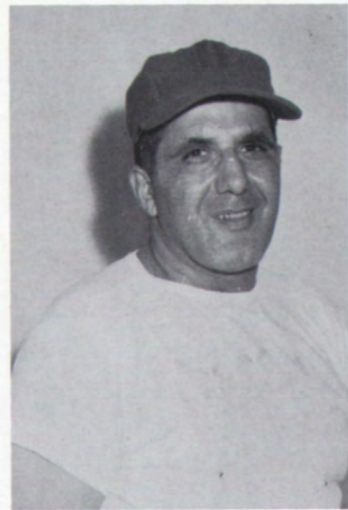
