

So to you, Mrs. Miles, we respectfully and lovingly dedicate the 1959 HI-WAYS. Good luck and God bless you in all your future activities.






Art Lancour scored the final touchdown and added the extra point to give Hialeah a 26-13 victory.










Edison Over-Powers T-Breds 41-7


Blocked Punt Beats Pioneers

Hialeah's squad emerged victorious, a little soggy around the edges but with their fighting spirit high and dry.
















Parsons Builds for 1960 Varsity Squad


Coach Clarence Parsons prides himself on the fact that he grooms the boys that will be the future varsity players at Hialeah High.

After losing four of their first seven games, the "Baby Thoroughbreds" showed new life and saw the creation of new spirit among the squad.










